Honeybees Report (4 year old)

The honeybees have had an exciting and busy start to the year. This term we have had a big focus on supporting our honeybees to settle into the new kinder year with lots of children joining our group from 3 year old kinder in 2022 and many others starting their kinder journey in 2023. We have enjoyed re-establishing relationships and building new ones with both our honeybees children and their families. We have been establishing new kinder routines, getting to know each other and really developing a sense of belonging to our kinder community through songs, group games, small group discussions and play!

We have had lots of children showing an interest in dinosaurs and have enjoyed a range of different dino themed activities including dinosaurs in the sandpit and digging patch, dinosaur books, dinosaur songs, dinosaur inspired art activities and dinosaur Duplo.

We were even lucky enough to welcome Foti from the Museum of Victoria in for a very fun, exciting and educational incursion where we got to explore real dinosaur bones and fossils!

Many of our honeybees children have shown an interest in writing their names and we will continue to support their letter recognition, name recognition and writing skills as their interests emerge. There are lots of other fun ways we are supporting fine motor skill development at kinder including play dough, sensory play, beading, puzzles, construction, painting, making/creating table, small world play, the list is endless!

As part of our School Readiness Funding (SRF) plan this year, our honeybee children will each be receiving a story book in the mail once a month. This amazing opportunity is provided by the Dolly Parton Imagination Library and aims to promote a love of all things books and reading. We encourage all of our honeybee families to enjoy sharing these books with their child/ren as this is a wonderful opportunity to promote early literacy skills.





We will be finishing up the term with lots of fun Easter themed activities and we are all looking forward to joining the school for their annual Easter Bonnet parade on our last day of term!

DINOSAUR VISIT FROM MELBOURNE

MUSEUM



Foti from the Melbourne Museum came to kindergarten and explained the difference between dinosaurs that are herbivores and carnivores and the

job of a palaeontologist. Foti read us a story about how the palaeontologists believe dinosaurs became extinct, sang and danced like a dinosaur and then we were allowed to carefully touch a the fossils head, leg and foot.

Herbivores eat leaves and pine cones and carnivores eat meat such as other dinosaurs. The palaeontologists believe the <u>Muttaburrasaurus</u> may have lived in or near water due to the beak shape of their mouth and flat square teeth. We built the leg of a <u>Muttaburrasaurus</u> - dinosaur bones found in Australia.

We all looked at a variety of fossils and even some - "COPROLITE" which is fossilised dinosaur poo and many of us lay on the floor next to the completed leg and it took three children to become the same size as the <u>Muttaburrasaus</u>' leg.

Outcome 4 children are involved learners - curiosity, imagination and research through learning
